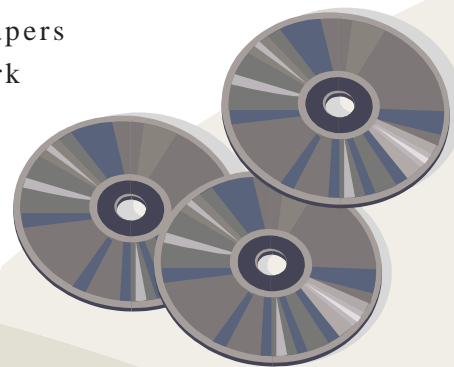

Benefits of Club membership

The Durham Personal Computer Users' Club is a self-help group in Durham Region for PC computer users who are experienced or new to computing.

The club, which formed in 1986, is a non-profit organization. Some members have been in the club since its founding days.

The club's goal is to help members understand how to use their computers and to help them keep current with the rapidly changing technology and software. Many members have joined to

gather information about how to get started with this new hobby.



NEWSLETTER

The club's newsletter, "PC Monitor", is published monthly. Members receive it electronically, and a print copy at the meeting. Our web site carries previous complete monthly newsletters.

Some of the columns feature the President's message, last meeting prize winners, report about the last guest presenter, interesting downloads, new software re-

views, and interesting news from different SIGs from time to time.

DOOR PRIZES

Guest speakers often donate door prizes. These and other prizes are drawn at the close of the meeting.

MEETINGS

We bring to members information about new hardware/software products and industry developments. Presentations/demonstrations by guest hardware or software vendors and by our own members help accomplish our club goals. Topics range from basic hardware issues (the computer or its peripherals), to methods

and procedures for getting the best performance from software or to warnings about potential problem areas.

SIGS (special interest groups)

Our special interest groups (SIGs) allow members of like interest to delve into certain aspects of computing. Currently, the club has several operating SIGs; Internet/beginners/Windows, WordPerfect, Linux, and Computer-Assisted-Design. SIGs can start or discontinue at any time depending on interest.

BUG SESSION

This popular feature at our monthly meetings is chaired by the club guru. This is an opportunity for members to ask

for advice about hardware or software problems. Commonly many helpful suggestions are offered often leading to a solution.

LIBRARY

Every month the club's librarian creates a review of public domain and shareware software that is published on the club's web site. He also prepares brief monthly articles for the FYI section of the club's newsletter concerning new software/hardware and/or upgrades and computing trends.

FREE COMPUTER

Another benefit of the DPCUC meetings is the opportunity to pickup the latest issue of computer papers, magazines or vendor catalogues.
